

Weekly Communion 22 April 2021

We as the body of Christ we are made up of many parts, each part functioning independently of each other.

1 Corinthians 12:13 NKJV For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit.

When Paul said we are baptized into and have been made to drink of one spirit.

- We see this as in our own humanity an individual and personal brokenness - yes it's definitely that! But
- He too is calling each and every broken part of the body of Christ together as well, so that as the bride of Christ we will be one whole church for when we get taken up together.
- He not only breaks bread with His disciples imparting to them about what is to come but also instructs us to do as He did... we as a body of disciples should remain in unity with one another until He eats and drinks with us again

The thing about unity is that we can pretend to toe the line with one another, until you are required to co-ordinate your movements together accomplishing the same goal.

E.g. When one sets out to learn dance steps, you begin with simple steps and then increase them until they become a sequence.

Once the music begins to play, the steps are taken according to the beat or Rhythm of the song played.

One soon learns how to coordinate your body with the music, which is really difficult, depending on how well you move in time to the beat as you dance.

Many have no rhythm and can only remember parts of the sequence causing breaks in the dance routine. From the ears to our baby toe... we need our body to work together.

Being in tune with the heartbeat is what keeps us moving in time to the drum of the song as it leads us around the dance floor. Should we not be able to hear the beat we can still feel the beat through vibrations of the drums and still move together.

God in His amazing wonder made us in a way that we can still hear Him and respond differently as we come together in His choreography; the message being the same, as we pause together in unison as we know and respond to sound of the voice of His Spirit.

God empowers the universal body to work together as one, bringing unity and oneness to His saints... through the Teacher of His word.

There is no new beat, no new song, no new message except

Do this in remembrance of Me, take eat ... My body, drink... of My cup... until I return
