

Weekly Communion 11 November 2021

1 Corinthians 11:23–25 NLT On the night when He was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread and gave thanks to God for it. Then He broke it in pieces and said, “This is My body, which is given for you. Do this to remember Me.” In the same way, He took the cup of wine after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant between God and His people—an agreement confirmed with My blood. Do this to remember Me as often as you drink it.”

It's so amazing to think we can Partake our way to Wholeness!

Wholeness comes through our ongoing realization of our Righteousness. One of the root words of righteousness is completeness!

1. The state of forming a complete and harmonious unity.
2. The state of being unbroken or undamaged.

As we partake of Communion we are actively remembering how Jesus willingly came to save you and suffered for your healing and recovery at the cross. Then we are able to resist any fear that would stop us from receiving healing or any of our needs met by Him.

That's what partaking of the Holy Communion is all about.

When you hold the bread in your hand, simply remember how Jesus' body was broken at the cross so that yours may be healed and whole.

Say: “Lord Jesus, thank You for bearing my condition on Your own body at the cross. When the lashes fell across Your back, my condition died. It has no right to linger in my body!”

Likewise, when you partake of the cup, remember that Jesus shed His blood to save you.

Say, “Jesus, thank You for Your shed blood that has washed away my sins and made me righteous. Because I am righteous in Your sight, healing and recovery belongs to me. So I receive all my needs met through your resurrection life in my life right now.”

Friends, remember the Lord Jesus and partake your way to divine health and victory!
